

SINO-AUSTRIAN SUMMER SCHOOL ON CHINESE HERBAL MEDICINE, SEPTEMBER 6TH TO 29TH 2019

In the course of the summer school, students of pharmacy will be given an insight into the basics of Traditional Chinese Medicine (basic principles, different methods, etc) and the herbal drugs used. The main focus is on getting to know important Chinese medicinal plants and drugs and their application.

The topics of quality assurance, pharmacopoeia methods, growing areas, peculiarities in cultivation, harvesting, processing and production are also discussed. At the Guangxi Botanical Garden of Medicinal Plants in Nanning, the largest medicinal plant garden in the world, all plants can be met alive. It will also include TCM museums, a TCM pharmacy, a TCM clinic, extractor Purapharm, pharmaceutical company Tasly, the drug market and China Southern Herbal Garden in Yulin, and crops near Guilin visited. Beijing will visit the TCM Museum of the Beijing University of Chinese Medicine and the research institutes of the Institute for Medicinal Plant Development, as well as the Tongrentang Pharmacy.
